

November Luncheon: JASON WOODBURY Carson City District Attorney

Jason Woodbury was chosen by voters as the 30th elected District Attorney of Carson City in November, 2014, and was re-elected to a second four-year term in June of 2018.





Attorney in both the criminal and civil divisions of the Carson City District Attorney's office under District Attorney Noel Waters. Prior to his election, Woodbury was a partner in the Carson City office of a statewide law firm where he worked for more than a decade.

Woodbury is very active in the Carson City community, serving on the Board of Directors of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Western Nevada from 2003 to 2017, including a term as President in 2008. In 2011, he completed the Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Carson City program. He was also a founding member of the Board of Directors of the Western Nevada affiliate of the National Alliance on Mental Illness.

Woodbury is the President-Elect of the Nevada District Attorney's Association and also serves on the steering committee for Partnership Carson City. Twice a year, he instructs a course on "Constitutional Law" to incoming officers at the Nevada Police Academy.

Woodbury met Stacy, his wife of 12 years, in Carson City. Their two children attend elementary school in Carson City. Woodbury's stepson, Noah Jennings, serves in the Nevada Army National Guard and attends the University of Nevada.

Direct Kudlow and Council of Economic Advisers Chairman Kevin Hassett discussed how President Trump's economic policies are delivering for Nevada's workers, families and employers. I thought you would enjoy a recap of our discussion.




Nevada

Nevada has demonstrated strong economic growth during the past year, with large employment gains and impressive growth in real personal income.

- Jobs in the state of Nevada have reached an all-time high since the election of President Trump with nearly 1.4 million employed. The rate of job gains in Nevada over the past 12 months is the second highest in the country.
- Since the election, real personal income in Nevada has increased by nearly 7 percent to reach the highest level ever recorded in the state of \$56,550.
- The unemployment rate in Nevada has fallen 0.9 percentage points since the election of President Trump to 4.5 percent, the lowest rate in over 10 years.
- The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act signed into law by President Trump last year is estimated to lead to a \$4,300 increase in wages for Nevada's average household.
- Under President Trump, the share of Nevadans that are high school graduates has increased to the highest rate ever recorded.
- Manufacturing employment in Nevada has grown 24 percent since President Trump was elected, making it the fastest growing sector in Nevada in terms of employment (see figure).



History of Veteran's Day

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied nations came into effect. On November 11, 1919, Armistice Day was commemorated for the first time. In 1919, President Wilson proclaimed the day should be "filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory". There were plans for parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business activities at 11am.

In 1926, the United States Congress officially recognized the end of World War I and declared that the anniversary of the armistice should be commemorated with prayer and thanksgiving. The Congress also requested that the president should "issue a proclamation calling upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples."

An Act was approved on May 13, 1938, which made November 11 in each year a legal holiday, known as Armistice Day. This day was originally intended to honor veterans of World War I. A few years later, World War II required the largest mobilization of service men in the history of the United States and the American forces fought in Korea. In 1954, the veteran's service organizations urged Congress to change the word "Armistice" to "Veterans". Congress approved this change and on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor all American veterans, where ever and whenever they had served.

In 1968 the Uniforms Holiday Bill made an attempt to move Veterans Day to the fourth Monday of October. The bill took effect in 1971. However, this caused a lot of confusion as many states disagreed with this decision and continued to hold Veterans Day activities on November 11. In 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed the Public Law Bill, which stated that Veterans Day would again be observed on November 11 from 1978 onwards. Veterans Day is still observed on November 11.



Trivia Answer

Lake County once encompassed the NW corner of Nevada. It became Roop County in 1862 and abolished in 1883 because of a lack of population—both were part of what is now Washoe County. Ormsby County was the previous name for Carson City. Bullfrog County was created in the mid-1980's to let the state heavily tax the federal government's proposed Yucca Mountain nuclear waste dump site. It was shortly thereafter ruled invalid by the Nevada Supreme Court.

















