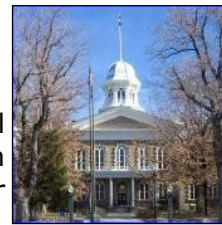

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

SHERI LeTOURNEAU, 1ST VP, LEGISLATIVE CHAIR



As of this writing, there is only one week until Session ends. Some of the bills which passed both Houses and are now in the office of the Governor are:

SB538 OFFICE OF NEW AMERICANS – This bill would create an office designed to assist immigrants in areas including business, education and entrepreneurial resources in their communities thereby making the transition to living in Nevada easier.

AB132 MARIJUANA AND EMPLOYMENT – This bill would bar employers from using a positive marijuana drug test to reject a job applicant and conduct another test within 30 days of employment.

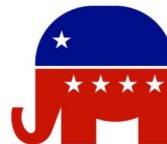
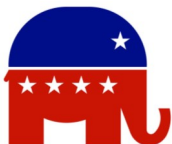
AB376 ICE AGREEMENTS – This bill only requires police officers asking questions about immigration status to inform the person why they are asking.

AB139 – UNDERAGE MARRIAGE – This bill, which originally would have set the minimum age of marriage to 18, was amended to change the minimum age to 17, with the consent of a parent or guardian and approval of a district court.

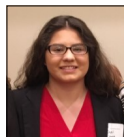
If the Governor does not act on any of the bills sent to his desk within five days, they become law without his signature.

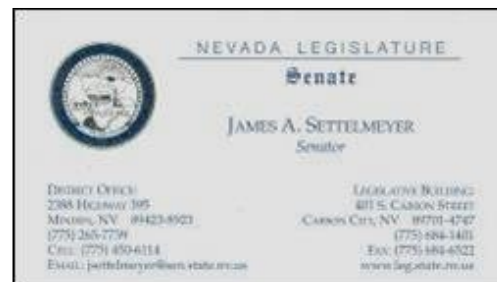

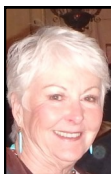

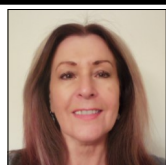
