



HISTORY OF INDEPENDENCE DAY

On July 4, 1776, the 13 colonies claimed their independence from England, an event which eventually led to the formation of the United States. Each year on the fourth of July, also known as Independence Day, Americans celebrate this historic event.

Conflict between the colonies and England was already a year old when the colonies convened a Continental Congress in Philadelphia in the summer of 1776. In a June 7 session in the Pennsylvania State House (later Independence Hall), Richard Henry Lee of Virginia presented a resolution with the famous words: "Resolved: That these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved."

Lee's words were the impetus for the drafting of a formal Declaration of Independence, although the resolution was not followed up on immediately. On June 11, consideration of the resolution was postponed by a vote of seven colonies to five, with New York abstaining. However, a Committee of Five was appointed to draft a statement presenting to the world the colonies' case for independence.

Members of the Committee included John Adams of Massachusetts; Roger Sherman of Connecticut; Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania; Robert R. Livingston of New York; and Thomas Jefferson of Virginia. The task of drafting the actual document fell on Jefferson.

On July 1, 1776, the Continental Congress reconvened, and on the following day, the Lee Resolution for independence was adopted by 12 of the 13 colonies, New York not voting.





Sadly, the one Democrat, Senator Joe Manchin from West Virginia, (who I had been beginning to have some respect for) has been trying to make some concessions to bring the parties together. One of his proposed changes is to allow DMV to register voters. As we know Nevada DMV registers voters with the possibility of illegals being able to register to vote. He does try to entice the Republicans to vote for this bill by suggesting Voter ID, but as I stated this bill is almost 800 pages long with the devil in the details. Luckily Mitch McConnel is stating that the Republican are going to stand together and vote no on this bill. We know that if the Democrats want this passed, it would somehow greatly benefit them.

The Filibuster is an additional item that we need to urgently address. The filibuster is a political strategy in which a senator speaks for hours on end to delay efforts to vote for a bill, and it offers unique leverage to the minority political party in the Senate.

There is a long history of the Filibuster. The strategy of "talking a bill to death" was common enough by the mid-19th century to gain a colorful label—the filibuster. According to the Oxford English Dictionary the term was derived from a Dutch word for "freebooter" and the Spanish "filibusteros"—to describe the pirates then raiding Caribbean islands, and it began appearing in American legislative debates in the 1850s . "I saw my friend standing on the other side of the aisle filibustering," commented Mississippi's Albert Brown on January 3, 1853.

Although Chuck Schumer keeps threatening to eliminate the filibuster, there are a few Democratic Senators who believe in keeping it. Without this strategy the party in power could dominate the Senate by passing laws that exclusively facilitate their political agenda. Changing or eliminating the filibuster involves amending the Rules of the Senate (see for examples "Rules of Debate" in https://www.rules.senate.gov/rules-of-the-senate)

You need to contact key Senators from Nevada and elsewhere to express your opinions on voting NO on HR.1/S.1 and retaining the Filibuster. Here are some helpful phone numbers:


