






NVGOP Links to Voter Fraud Info - 2020 General Election

Categories of mail-in ballot fraud - these are all actual ballots cast:

- 42,284 duplicate votes cast by voters with matching name, address and birthdate
 15,164 out of state votes (non-student, non-military)
- 8,842 votes from commercial addresses
 3,463 votes from vacant properties
- 3,262 votes from non-existent addresses (vacant lots, etc.)
- 2,468 votes from voters who have permanently changed their residence address to another state
- 1,506 votes from deceased voters
- 3,987 votes from non-US citizens

ST. PATRICK

Saint Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland. He was a Christian missionary credited with converting Ireland to Christianity in the AD 400s. So many legends surround his life that the truth is not easily found.

St Patrick was not actually Irish. His exact birthplace and date is not known. However, it is believed he was born around 375AD in Scotland. His parents, Calpurnius & Conchessa, were Romans living in Britain in charge of the colonies. His real name is believed to be Maewyn Succat and he took on the name Patrick upon becoming a priest. As a teen he was kidnapped by pirates and sold into slavery in Ireland to herd and tend sheep on Slemish mountain, Co Antrim.

During his six-year captivity, he became fluent in the Irish language, he turned to God in prayer. He escaped after having a dream sent from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast where he would find a ship waiting to sail to Britain. He is believed to have met up with his parents in Wales before travelling to France where he became a priest and later a bishop.

Patrick was sent another dream in which the people of Ireland were calling out to him to come and walk among them once more. He was set the task of teaching Christianity to the Irish. He travelled throughout Ireland, preaching the Gospel and converting many. He and his disciples preached and converted thousands and began building churches all over the country. Patrick preached and converted all over Ireland for 40 years. The date cited for when Ireland was converted to Christianity is 432.

There is much debate over when and where he died. It is believed he died on 17 March, 460 at Saul, Downpatrick. That is why Saint Patrick's Day is celebrated on March 17th. Some people suggest he was also born on 17 March.

The clans of Ireland began to bicker over who should receive the honor of having his final resting-place on their land. To avoid this sacrilegious end to his life, his friends secreted away his body to bury in a secret grave. Many believe this to be in Downpatrick, County Down, where there is a permanent memorial.

MEMBERSHIP DUES

Opening the Nevada Legislature

More than 23 days have passed since Opening Day of the 81st session of the Nevada Legislature. To date, there have been 23 floor sessions in the Senate and Assembly, 58 committee meetings, and 121 bill hearings, but not a single member of the public has been allowed to come into the THEIR legislative building, or to meet in person with THEIR representatives to discuss the issues that matter most to them.

The current system enforced by legislative Democrats has made public testimony difficult at best. Members of the public can only call in to have their voices heard, and many of these calls, across every committee, have suffered from technical difficulties or have even been dropped. Policy decisions are being made that will affect every Nevadan, yet leadership in both the Assembly and the Senate have kept everyone but the mainstream media out of the People's House. Good policy cannot be created in a vacuum.

It's time for this to change -- and the Nevada Legislative Freedom Caucus stands with the bipartisan effort of many other organizations in Nevada, both left and right, in calling on legislative leaders to open the building to the public. This can be accomplished using the same type of distancing guidelines that are in place for Nevada's businesses, schools, and churches to keep people safe while allowing them to remain involved in the legislative process.

"Instead of 'virtually' doing the business of the people, we must **actually** do the business of the people," said Assemblyman Jim Wheeler, the Freedom Caucus' Chairman. "That means opening this building and allowing the people of Nevada to speak to their elected representatives in person."

Returning Power to the People's Branch

The Coronavirus pandemic has taught us many things about our health, our families, our work, and our priorities. Another thing that we have learned through these trying times is that we have placed entirely too much trust in the executive branch of our state government. Our system of government was built to be deliberative, and to preserve the rights and freedoms of the people through checks and balance between branches of government. In order for this system to work, each branch of government must be able to exert its authority over the actions of state government.

It is unfortunate that this system, that our founders envisioned, is thrown out whenever times get tough. The governor is rightfully afforded certain emergency powers, and has the authority to use them when necessary. However, when applied, those powers should have limitations. There should be checks and balances, and the legislature should exercise its representative authority to make sure that the actions of the executive branch are appropriate.

The unrestricted and unilateral directives that the governor has placed on Nevada's businesses, schools, families, and churches have done extensive damage and have set a dangerous precedent. For these reasons the Nevada Legislative Freedom Caucus supports Assembly Bill 93, sponsored by Assemblyman Jim Wheeler, which places a 15-day limit on the governor's emergency powers without legislative approval.

"This is not a partisan issue. Nevada has had more Republicans than Democrats in the Governor's Office," said Assemblyman Wheeler. "Our goal is to preserve the voice of the people when decisions are being made that affect their families, health, livelihood, and communities."

We ask that everyone contact their legislators and respectfully ask that AB93 be heard and vetted in committee and get a vote on the floor. We also ask that you forward this email to everyone you know who believes in the principles of our constitution and it's separation of powers and ask them to contact their legislators as well.

How to Sign Up to Testify Virtually at the Nevada Legislature

Janine Hansen of Nevada Families for Freedom has published an excellent step-by-step guide for how you can participate in the legislative process even as legislative leaders continue to ban the public from entering the building...

Simple Step by Step Instructions

- Go to www.leg.state.nv.us
- You must know the Committee, Meeting time and the specific Bill number.
- Click on "Scheduled Meetings" on the right-hand side of the top blue bar.
- Scroll down to the Date, Time and the Specific Committee.
- Click on the Name of the Committee.
- A screen will come up with the Date, Time, and Committee name.
- Below that is a box that says "Additional Meeting Details."
- There are four boxes. Click on the fourth box "Participate."
- A white screen will pop up which says "Participate."
- Scroll to the bottom of the screen and click on "Participate."
- A new screen will appear. Enter you First Name, Last Name, Phone number and Email and any other details you want to include.
- Below that it says "Are you here for an "Agenda Item" or "Public Comment"?
- If you plan to speak on a specific bill check "Agenda Item". If you plan to speak during public comment (not on the specific bill) check "Public Comment."
- All Testimony is being limited strictly to two minutes. Prepare your remarks accordingly.
- When you check "Agenda Item" another screen will come up. Click on "Bill or Budget" and Click on the Bill number you wish to address.
- Next to "Bill or Budget" is "Position" click on the down arrow. Click on "Support", "Oppose" or "Neutral" for the bill you will be testifying on.
- Below "Bill or Budget" is another box which is "Representing". If you are representing an organization type it in there. If you are representing yourself, just type self.
- Next to the "Representing" box is "I wish to speak on this item", Check that box.
- If you are speaking on more than one item then click on the blue box "+Add this item." Otherwise, do not click on "+Add this item."
- Below is a white box, Click on "I'm not a robot." Follow instructions.
- Click on blue box on right hand corner "Submit."
- New Screen comes up, "Meeting Participation Success."
- It tells you who to contact if any of the information is incorrect.
- It tells you an Email will be sent confirming your participation, giving you the number to call and the meeting ID which you will have to enter.
- In the green box below, it also has the phone number to call and the meeting ID.
- When the meeting starts, they may have multiple items on the agenda. If you want to be sure to speak you must call in by the time the meeting starts or you can try when the item comes up on the agenda. They often change the order of agenda items for the hearing.
- When your Bill is opened for testimony those in favor go first, those opposed next and neutral last. The phone manager will say all those who want to speak in favor press "star *9" and when they are finished, he will say all those opposed press *9. You will be placed in a queue (online waiting list), waiting for your turn.
- You will be able to listen to all the testimony on the phone.
- When the phone manager announces the last 3 numbers of your phone number it is your turn to testify.
- You may also be asked to press *6 to unmute yourself or they may unmute you.
- Give your name and spell it. Then give your two-minute testimony. Be polite.
- There is a 45 second delay between the video broadcast of the Committee hearing online and the hearing on the phone.
- They usually allow up to 30 minutes for testimony (it could be less) so if you do not have an opportunity to participate please send in written testimony which will be added to the Legislative Record. However, usually

everyone can testify.

- If you do speak you should also send in your written testimony.

How to Submit Written Testimony on a Bill

- Go thru the first 4 steps on the "How to Testify" list. Then on the far-right side next to the name of the Committee click on "Agenda".
- The Committee agenda will come up. At the bottom is the email of the committee. Submit your written testimony to the email for the Committee. Include the number of the bill, your name and address.

How to Submit your Opinion on a Bill

- Go thru the first 7 steps on the "How to Testify" list.
- There are four boxes, Click on the third box "Submit Opinion". Fill out the form.
