

We're "Springing Forward", celebrating Easter and Passover, and bringing out the sundresses and transitional season jackets.









- <u>Mail in Ballots to everyone.</u> You will have to opt out if you do not want a mail in ballot. There will be concern if the ballot was mailed incorrectly during the election cycle.
- **Electronic Devices** (Optical Scan provided by Dominion Voting Systems) to Verify signatures. Joe Gloria, the voter registrar in Las Vegas adjusted his Optical Scan lower to 40% acceptance rate of signatures 10% lower than the manufacture's recommendation. These machines will also accept good quality photo copies of ballots. There are huge implications and opportunity for fraud.
- **<u>Automatic Voter Registration</u>** with DMV, once registered you don't have to show ID for voting. Illegal people in the state of NV can get a DRIVER AUTHORIZATION CARD (NRS 483.230), it looks just like yours and mine. The Number is also the same as ours as they don't want to discriminates even though they are here illegally. Understand, if they have this card, they will not be asked if they are legally qualified to vote at other locations. It will be illegal to ask for any other identification. This Legislation will destroy Nevada.

What can you do? Start calling all of the assemblymen\women and tell them NO do not vote for this bill, WE want Voter Integrity. Call, email and share with everyone. Have your family and friends call to oppose this bill. We need hundreds of people to call. You can also do written testimony opposing the bill at the Legislative website. The Primary Sponsor of this bill is Assemblyman Jason Frierson <a href="mailto:jason.Frierson@ASM.state.nv.us">jason.Frierson@ASM.state.nv.us</a>.





### **MEMBERSHIP DUES**

CCRW annual dues are \$40 per member and \$20 per Associate Member per year. As required by the NFRW all NvFRW clubs send a portion (\$25)of our membership dues to our State Treasurer, with the following rates in effect - \$5 per member per year stays with the NvFRW and \$20 per member per year is sent to the NFRW. The \$20 Associate dues stay with our CCRW club.

Due to printing and mailing related costs, the cost for those wishing a USPS mailed copy of the newsletter is \$20/year.

The membership year runs January 1 through December 31. <u>Dues not paid by March 31 are</u> considered delinquent.

### **PASSOVER**

Each spring, Jews around the world celebrate Passover, a holiday that commemorates the Israelites' escape from slavery in ancient Egypt. Passover celebrations include attending religious services, gathering with friends and family, and having a Seder, or religious meal.

And especially after the hardships that came for many in 2020 with the ongoing global pandemic, police brutality and social unrest, and incredibly high levels of unemployment, Passover in 2021 will be a time to think about new beginnings. In the season of spring, a time of rebirth and leaving behind gray winter days, Passover calls on Jews to look back to a time of oppression that ended with a new beginning and a new path forward to find safer and better things ahead.

The holiday lasts for eight nights and throughout Passover, Jews stick to strict dietary rules including not eating any leavened bread products such as bread and pasta, which is meant to symbolize the fact that the Israelites did not have time for their bread to rise when they were fleeing Egypt. In addition to other traditional Passover recipes, *matzah* or *matzo* is eaten, which is a sort of cracker that's specially made for Passover. *Matzo* meal can also be used to make dishes like matzah ball soup, which is a tasty chicken broth soup that often has vegetables like carrots and celery and features fluffy balls made of matzah.

While Passover marks the Jews' escape from ancient Egyptian slavery, the holiday is also a time for Jews to gather with friends and family to discuss topics like freedom, equality, and finding your place in a world that has not always been, and in many ways still isn't, welcoming.

If you're new to the Jewish faith, or just curious about this important Jewish holiday, here's what you need to know about this year's Passover:

The date of Passover changes each year, since Jewish holidays rely on a lunar calendar, not the Gregorian calendar. **This year, Passover begins at sundown on March 27 and ends on April 4.** Many people have Passover seders the first and/or second nights of Passover, so **seders will occur on March 27 and 28**.









# A FEW EASTER TRADITIONS DYEING EASTER EGGS

The tradition of decorating eggs of all kinds—even ostrich eggs—may go all the way back to the ancient pagans. It's easy to see why eggs represent rebirth and life, so associating them with spring and new growth isn't much of a stretch. To celebrate the new season, it's said that people colored eggs and gave them to friends and family as gifts. When Christians came along, they likely incorporated the tradition into their celebrations. According to some legends, Mary or Mary Magdalene could be responsible for our annual trek to the store to buy vinegar and dye tablets. As the story goes, Mary brought eggs with her to Jesus's crucifixion, and blood from his wounds fell on the eggs, coloring them red. Another tells us that Mary Magdalene brought a basket of cooked eggs to share with other women at Jesus's tomb three days after his death. When they rolled back the stone and found the tomb empty, the eggs turned red.

### THE EASTER BUNNY

At first glance, it's hard to imagine what a giant rabbit has to do with any type of religious holiday. But according to *Time*, the tradition again dates back to the pagans. They celebrated a goddess of fertility named Easter—and you may recall that fertility is exactly the trait rabbits are most famous for. It's thought that German immigrants brought their tradition of an egg-laying hare called *Osterhase* to the U.S. in the 1700s.

### **EASTER BASKETS**

If you squint at an Easter basket, especially one stuffed with faux shredded grass, you can totally see its origins as a nest. Remember the German *Osterhase* tradition? Well, there was more to it. To encourage this mythical bunny to stop by their houses, children would fashion nests for it to come and lay its colored eggs. Over time (and maybe to contain the mess), the nests <u>evolved</u> into baskets.

# How to Sign Up to Testify Virtually at the Nevada Legislature

Janine Hansen of Nevada Families for Freedom has published an excellent step-by-step guide for how you can participate in the legislative process even as legislative leaders continue to ban the public from entering the building...

# **Simple Step by Step Instructions**

- Go to www.leg.state.nv.us
- You must know the Committee, Meeting time and the specific Bill number.
- Click on "Scheduled Meetings" on the right-hand side of the top blue bar.
- Scroll down to the Date, Time and the Specific Committee.
- Click on the Name of the Committee.
- A screen will come up with the Date, Time, and Committee name.
- Below that is a box that says "Additional Meeting Details."
- There are four boxes. Click on the fourth box "Participate."
- A white screen will pop up which says "Participate."
- Scroll to the bottom of the screen and click on "Participate."
- A new screen will appear. Enter you First Name, Last Name, Phone number and Email and any other details you want to include.
- Below that it says "Are you here for an "Agenda Item" or "Public Comment"?
- If you plan to speak on a specific bill check "Agenda Item". If you plan to speak during public comment (not on the specific bill) check "Public Comment."
- All Testimony is being limited strictly to two minutes. Prepare your remarks accordingly.
- When you check "Agenda Item" another screen will come up. Click on "Bill or Budget" and Click on the Bill number you wish to address.
- Next to "Bill or Budget" is "Position" click on the down arrow. Click on "Support", "Oppose" or "Neutral" for the bill you will be testifying on.
- Below "Bill or Budget" is another box which is "Representing". If you are representing an organization type it in there. If you are representing yourself, just type self.
- Next to the "Representing" box is "I wish to speak on this item", Check that box.
- If you are speaking on more than one item then click on the blue box "+Add this item." Otherwise, do not click on "+Add this item."
- Below is a white box, Click on "I'm not a robot." Follow instructions.
- Click on blue box on right hand corner "Submit."
- New Screen comes up, "Meeting Participation Success."
- It tells you who to contact if any of the information is incorrect.
- It tells you an Email will be sent confirming your participation, giving you the number to call and the meeting ID which you will have to enter.
- In the green box below, it also has the phone number to call and the meeting ID.
- When the meeting starts, they may have multiple items on the agenda. If you want to be sure to speak you must call in by the time the meeting starts or you can try when the item comes up on the agenda. They often change the order of agenda items for the hearing.
- When your Bill is opened for testimony those in favor go first, those opposed next and neutral last. The phone manager will say all those who want to speak in favor press "star \*9" and when they are finished, he will say all those opposed press \*9. You will be placed in a queue (online waiting list), waiting for your turn.
- You will be able to listen to all the testimony on the phone.
- When the phone manager announces the last 3 numbers of your phone number it is your turn to testify.
- You may also be asked to press \*6 to unmute yourself or they may unmute you.
- Give your name and spell it. Then give your two-minute testimony. Be polite.
- There is a 45 second delay between the video broadcast of the Committee hearing online and the hearing on the phone.
- They usually allow up to 30 minutes for testimony (it could be less) so if you do not have an opportunity to participate please send in written testimony which will be added to the Legislative Record. However, usually

everyone can testify.

- If you do speak you should also send in your written testimony.
- If you have difficulty, for instance if they say "no such meeting number exists", you can call the Help line: 775-684-1300 or Email helpdesk@lcb.state.nv.us.

# **How to Submit Written Testimony on a Bill**

- Go thru the first 4 steps on the "How to Testify" list. Then on the far-right side next to the name of the Committee click on "Agenda".
- The Committee agenda will come up. At the bottom is the email of the committee. Submit your written testimony to the email for the Committee. Include the number of the bill, your name and address.

# How to Submit your Opinion on a Bill

- Go thru the first 7 steps on the "How to Testify" list.
- There are four boxes, Click on the third box "Submit Opinion". Fill out the form.
