Update on the Republican Logo with upside down stars

We received a response to the question I pondered in the last issue of this newsletter. WHO, WHEN, AND WHY were the stars on the GOP elephant turned upsidedown? It piqued the curiosity of one of our readers, who sent me this informative email with links to some answers.

I could not resist looking up your question about why the stars on the elephant logo are upside down. Check these out. "Why were the stars turned upside down in the Republican Elephant in 2000?" This Bing video explains the star concern.

Thanks, Kathryn; this research disproves at least two of the below-noted myths surrounding the change.

A Few of the Theories

- The GOP made a deal with the devil, and the inverted stars represent a pentagram!
- When a country is in distress, its flag is flown upside down—thus the change.

 Some college intern graphic designers did it for fun to see if anyone would notice.

As a result of the research Kathryn found, we can rule out that the change came in 2000. Many campaign logos and election buttons before the emergence of Bush Jr. portrayed the stars upsidedown. So, that rules out the deal with the devil theory. You can see examples on the website: Political Pistachio: Study of the GOP's Upside Down Stars (referenced earlier).

Further, this change—the elephant with the three upsidedown stars did not happen randomly or covertly. According to U.S. Trademark Applications and Registrations Retrieval database, it was issued Trademark No. 1908397. The trademark registration filed in 1993, was registered in 1995. The application cites a first use date in 1969 and includes the rule booklet from the 1972 Republican Convention, complete with upside-down logo stars.

So that debunks the theory that some graphic artist made the change accidentally or as a joke.

However, it still leaves the question, who decided on the reversal when the trademark was applied for and why it was done? *Still wondering*...






