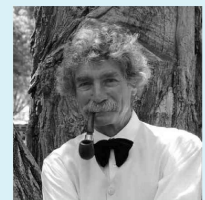

News from the Second V.P. of Programs

The highly anticipated Nevada primary held on June 14 election day has come and gone. Some people are delighted that their chosen candidates won, and some are angry or disappointed that their candidates were not victorious.



There will be many lessons learned from this primary as an example: Do we really need two weeks of early voting? It's my opinion it can be done in one week. The resources spent on the first week could be utilized in the second week of early voting. People need to understand fully the OPT-OUT option. Ballots cost \$5 a piece with paper, printing, and mailing; in researching *How the World Votes*, **all developed countries except ours, do not have universal mail-in-ballots. Russia in 1997 banned mail-in-ballots as it was too corrupt.** Moving forward, our Clerk-Recorder, Audrey Rowlett will have a few moments to consider what changes she lawfully can make before they need to start preparing for the General Election in November.

Surprisingly, the turnout was only 26.74% of the 39,153 voters in this primary. In 2018 we had 29,459 voters, and 30.75% voted. We need to get everyone out to vote in November—it's a must.

As we approach the November election, we must put all of our grievances aside and vote for All Republican candidates. Do this for your children's and grandchildren's sake.

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

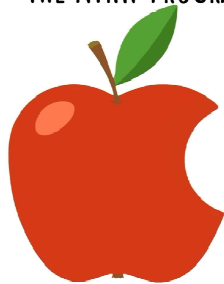
Joining a local group such as the Carson City Republicans Womens club is a great way to participate in the political process at the grassroots level and to network with other women in your community. By paying dues to her local club, a Republican woman automatically becomes a member of her state federation and of the National Federation of Republican Women.

Membership in the National Federation of Republican Women is an opportunity for women to find their voice and make a difference. As a member of a local club, every Republican woman has a voice in that club, as well as in both her state federation and the NFRW.

CCRW annual dues are \$40 per member and \$20 per Associate Member per calendar year. The NFRW requires that all NvFRW clubs send a portion (\$25) of our membership dues to our State Treasurer, with the following rates in effect — \$5 per member per year stays with the NvFRW, and \$20 per member per year is sent to the NFRW. The \$20 associate member dues remain with our CCRW club.

Those wishing to receive a printed copy of the monthly newsletter may pay an additional \$20 to help defray the cost of printing and mailing. The membership year runs January 1 through December 31. Dues not paid by March 31 are considered delinquent.

Caring for America

The National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) established the Caring for America program in 1999 to actively encourage state federations and clubs to participate in at least one community service program. Caring for America is based on the belief that *problems can be solved* most effectively through individual citizens' generosity and combined energies.

Caring for America programs may be completed by the state or club individually or in collaboration with other community agencies. Republican women always step forward when they see an area needing assistance, whether hands-on or through donations of needed food or other commodities. The NFRW Caring for America Committee compiles a comprehensive list of activities provided to all Federated Republican women's clubs.

The Caring for America Committee comprises region leaders from various member states who each work with the state presidents in their assigned region to promote the Caring for America program. These region leaders meet before the national biennial convention to review submissions from state presidents to determine the NFRW Caring for America Award winners in each size category. The NFRW recognizes each winner with a certificate at the biennial convention.

Biden Has Set Up the Perfect Storm for a #RedWave

While gas prices continue to rise, President Biden is off to Saudi Arabia to negotiate for a few more barrels of oil. Meanwhile, we have turned off the spigot in our country, and fuel prices are the highest in years, with 19 states averaging over \$5 per gallon.



Inflation is surging and has spread to nearly every corner of the economy. Costs are rising for gas, as well as for rent, clothing, medical care, food, and airline travel. Next, the Federal Reserve plans to raise interest rates.

The president's press secretary stumbled over the question of the status of baby formula and had no answer for the families still waiting. In the meantime, she gives glowing reports of the economy.

HIGH COST OF CHEAP LABOR

The most significant factor influencing why seniors are losing more and more benefits is that they are being blamed for part of our country's increasing deficit. However, look at how all these individual programs that benefit non-citizens impact our tax

A fitting symbol for the Republican Party

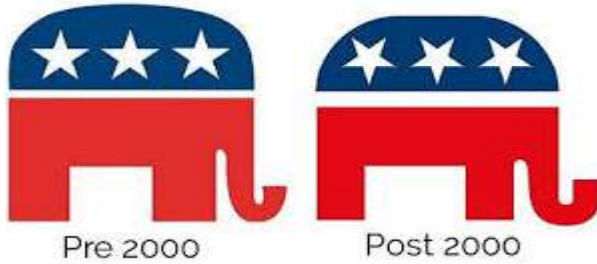


Strength & Power:

The elephant symbolizes strength and power in the most general, universal meaning. This meaning refers to both the body and the mind. Some also see the elephant as a spirit guide to help us along a journey that requires patience. Elephants are revered symbols in many cultures, as they are the largest living land mammals. The wish-fulfilling elephant is a prominent symbol of protection, wisdom, dignity, leadership qualities, and courage.

Just Wondering...

Does anybody know, when, or why the stars were turned upside down on the Republican Elephant Logo?



While working with graphics, I noted the Republican logo looked odd. On some of the elephants, I found the stars had been inverted. Upside down stars may seem insignificant, but who and why would change the logo? Especially strange for a party with many religious members and voters, including Christian fundamentalists and evangelists, who might take such symbolism seriously. More surprising, why don't we hear anyone talking about it? For many years the five-pointed stars on our elephant logo and the American Flag have pointed up toward the heavens. Now, with no explanation I can find, they have been reversed.

The stars have the shape of a pentagram. In the occult world, the shape of a pentagram pointing down is commonly used as a symbol of evil. Here is a quote from Wikipedia.

Let us keep the figure of the Five-pointed Star always upright, with the topmost triangle pointing to heaven, for it is the seat of wisdom, and if the figure is reversed, perversion and evil will be the result. (Man inscribed in a pentagram, from Heinrich Cornelius Agrippa's De occulta philosophia libri tres/the three Books of Occult Philosophy.)

So, given the GOP's sizable Christian voter base, it seems strange that anyone would arbitrarily change such a significant symbol. Can anyone share with us why this revision occurred? Has there been any debate about it? When did it happen? Who initiated the change? Was it a graphical mistake that went unnoticed, or some trick slipped in by a Democrat underground? 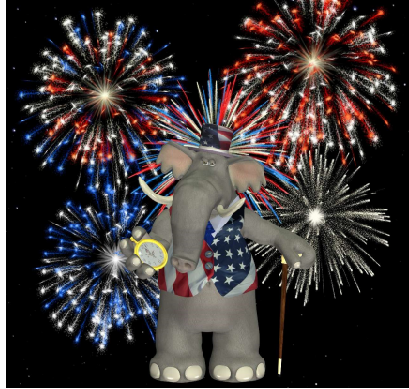

Why Fireworks?



Have you ever wondered why we set off those kaleidoscopes of gunpowder in our sky each Fourth of July? The history of fireworks in America is as old as the country itself.

Our first Independence Day celebration was held in Philadelphia on July 4, 1777, when the country was still amidst the Revolutionary War against Britain. Citizens came together to watch their new nation's sky illuminated in a grand display meant to raise spirits.

It was thought to have been created as a morale booster, and it worked. The news spread, and Fourth of July celebrations with fireworks took hold quickly in other places around the USA.

One of our Founding Fathers had even predicted that Americans would commemorate their independence with pomp and circumstance. On July 3, 1776, a day ahead of the Continental Congress's adoption of the final version of the Declaration of Independence, Massachusetts delegate John Adams penned a letter to his wife, envisioning the festivities.

"It ought to be commemorated as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty..." he wrote.

However, that first fireworks display was a far cry from today's elaborate, choreographed pyrotechnic shows. Fireworks displays certainly have grown and not only in complexity. The American Pyrotechnics Assn. (APA) estimates that more than 14,000 fireworks displays light up the nation's sky each Independence Day.

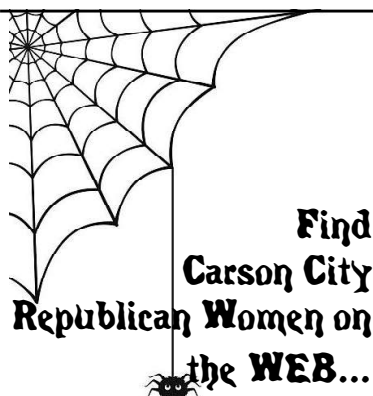

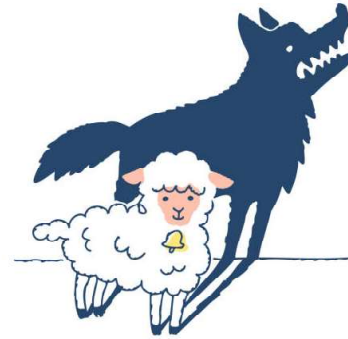
