The Republican candidates for president revealed more than they thought on Wednesday night.

I've been studying nonverbal communication for over 50 years, 25 of them as an FBI agent specializing in decoding human behavior. I learned that humans are fairly good at lying — but they're lousy at concealing their true emotions, especially when stressed. We reveal our unspoken thoughts in our bodies: faces flushed with embarrassment, lips pursed at unwelcome questions, fingers cov-

Body language is the primary means by which we communicate, revealing our true thoughts and feelings. It tells stories that canned speeches do not.

And what a story it told at last night's GOP primary debate.

As the eight Republican candidates — Trump, the frontrunner, was conspicuously absent — traded rhetorical blows, I watched with the sound off to focus solely on their body language: the handshakes, the gestures, the revealing facial expressions. Then I turned the sound on to assess how their tone of voice and words matched or conflicted with their nonverbal language. Through body language alone, the candidates revealed their passion, their resolve, their hopes and fears — and they might just have won some precious undecided voters to their side.

Here's what I noticed at this debate:







RON DESANTIS LOOKED ANGRY



As Trump's closest rival, Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis spoke first. He was a little nervous, as to be expected from the opening candidate: His lips quivered. He also looked almost angry. His voice was forceful and lacked modulation, which made it hard for viewers to distinguish his most important points. And throughout most of the event, he failed to smile. That may not seem like much, but part of leading is showing all sides of your personality.

DeSantis has been criticized — even by his own party! — <u>for being socially inept</u>. But I did not see that. I saw a very serious candidate who is concerned about the issues; it's clear from the tension in his face. His glabella (the space between your eyebrows) furrowed, which along with his emphatic hand gestures expressed his concern. DeSantis' body language may not have communicated likeability, an important factor for undecided voters looking for a candidate they can trust, but he did show viewers that he considers the issues raised in the debate to be of the utmost importance.

POW & MIA BRACELETS

Nickel-plated and copper bracelets, created about May of 1970, had the rank, name, and 'loss' date engraved on the bracelet.

During the Viet Nam war, 726 soldiers were taken prisoner and or killed. Of those, 661 were returned. Two college students came up with the idea to make bracelets to increase awareness of the ongoing war without controversy so our POWs would not be forgotten.

Nickel bracelets cost 30 cents to make, and copper was 75 cents. They sold for \$2.50 and \$3.00. Over four million were sold, with \$7 million raised. Movie stars, fashion models, and grandparents wore them. They were worn all the time, only taken off to shower. They often turned the skin green, prompting many people to line the inside of the bracelet with clear nail polish.

When the POW came home, the bracelets were often given to the soldier. There are three on display at the National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C.




